

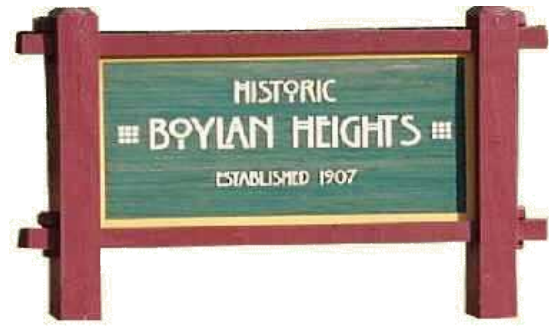

Flora, Fauna, Figures and Fantasy Captured in Four Photographer Exhibit

Four photographers represent four totally different styles, subjects, and techniques. From the clean, crisp, colored still life structures of Kim Kauffman to the abstracted, strobe-like figures in motion of Stephen Aubuchon, this is photography at it's most diverse. All are featured in the Adam Cave Fine Art photography exhibit opening June 26th.

For Diana Bloomfield, the pinhole camera provides a natural frame for her ethereal figures and dreamy settings. For instance, a female form is framed by the contrasting circular sculpture that surrounds her at the North Carolina Museum of Art. In addition to using an antiquated camera method, Bloomfield makes her own photographic paper and chooses platinum prints for tone and permanence.

Andrew Ross uses state-of-the-art lenses to carefully compose his large-scale photographs, leaving all but the missing subject slightly out of focus. Patiently, he waits for the pivotal moment when his selected centerpiece, a moving train or a walking figure, appears in position, clearly defined in detail. Round-the-world locations appear through Ross's lens.

As for Aubuchon, his dancing female figures are always moving before the viewers eyes, identifiable with concentration, graceful and elegant. At times the subjects seems vague and distant while others appear to zoom into view. Printed on fine art paper, Aubuchon's

photographs take on the look of loose, watercolor painting.

Kim Kauffman incorporates a variety of natural elements like leaves, feathers and flowers from her garden in her cameraless photography. She scans each component, then layers them, montage fashion, in the computer. The resulting still lives are both reality and fantasy combined. Often, man-made objects appear in her compositions as contrasts and to the organic subjects.

This collection of four photographers incorporates a wide array of techniques from ancient to cutting-edge. The exhibit is at Adam Cave Fine Art until August 9th. The gallery occupies the second floor of an historic, 100-year old building at 115-1/2 East Hargett Street and is located in the Moore Square Arts District in the heart of Raleigh's revitalized downtown.

Joel Lane Museum House - "The Birthplace of North Carolina's Capital" is having a Fourth of July celebration on Friday, July 4, 2008, 1 p.m. - 4 p.m., Raleigh, NC. The event is free and open to the public.

The Joel Lane Museum House, "The Birthplace of North Carolina's Capital," will sponsor its annual Independence Day Open House on Friday, July 4, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. at 728 W. Hargett St. Colonel Lane was a founding father of North Carolina's capital city and an officer in the Militia during the American Revolutionary War.



The theme for 2008 is "An Old-Fashioned July Fourth." On the grounds, re-enactors will demonstrate various aspects of colonial life such as spinning and dyeing and soldiering. There will be crafts and games for the children and "Hands-on History" demonstrations of colonial tools, toys and clothing. Music will be provided by the string quartet, "Flies in the Kitchen" and by "Triangle Mountain Dulcimers."

Collector Jim Jones of Cary, N.C., an expert on American colonial numismatics, will give a short presentation on Colonial Currency at 1 p.m.

In addition to outdoor activities, the circa 1770 plantation manor will be open for tours. The garden will be on view.

Subjects Needed for Tick Rash Study

As part of a study to better understand tick-related rashes, researchers are looking for people who:

- Have a circular red rash surrounding a tick bite that is at least 2 inches across,
- Are not under treatment with antibiotics, and
- Are willing to have two small skin biopsies of the rash and two blood samples taken.
- Who are aged 18 and older.

Persons who have such a rash and are interested in enrolling are encouraged to telephone (252)-724-8249. If you are accepted into the study you will receive a free medical visit and \$250.

The research study is being conducted by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, East Carolina University, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and selected medical practices in Eastern and Central North Carolina.
